I am writing to you on behalf of the Implementation Committee under the Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context (Espoo, 1991) and its Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment (Kyiv, 2003).

I am writing to you on behalf of the Implementation Committee under the Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context (Espoo, 1991) and its Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment (Kyiv, 2003).

As you are aware, on 2 April 2014, non-governmental organization (NGO) Bankwatch Romania provided information to the Implementation Committee regarding the planned construction by Serbia of a lignite power plant in north-east Serbia, by the River Danube, close to the border with Romania. At its thirty-first session (Geneva, 2–4 September 2014), the Committee began its consideration of the information provided regarding the activity. Due to possible issues arising in relation to the Protocol, the Committee at its thirty-second session (Geneva, 9–11 December 2014), begun gathering information concerning the domestic and transboundary strategic environmental procedures according to the Protocol for the Energy Strategy and the Spatial Plan (information gathering case with symbol SEA/IC/INFO/1). At its forty-sixth session (Geneva, 10–13 December 2019) the Committee decided to begin a Committee initiative further to paragraph 6 of the Committee's Structure and functions.

In the context of its proceeding regarding the matter the Committee gathered information from Hungary, as a potentially affected Party. The information provided by Hungary is referred to in the attached draft findings and recommendations prepared by the Committee at its fifty-first session (4–7 October 2021) as set out in paragraph 9 of the Committee's Structure and functions following its meeting with representatives of

the Government of Serbia on 10 November 2020.

You may recall that, according to paragraph 9 of the Committee's Structure and functions and Rule 13 of the Committee's Operating rules, the Committee shall send a copy of the draft findings and recommendations to the Parties concerned, and shall take into account any representations from such Parties in the finalization of the draft. In accordance with this provision, the Government of Hungary is invited to submit to the secretariat **by 5 January 2022** at the latest your comments or representations.

The Implementation Committee will consider these comments or representations before finalizing its findings and recommendations at its fifty-second session (1–4 February 2022). Once finalized, the Committee's findings and recommendations shall be submitted to the fifth session of the Meeting of the Parties, which is expected to be held in December 2023, for consideration.
