
Financial and budgetary matters*

Note by the secretariat

Summary

The present note sets out the financial requirements for the implementation of activities under the Convention on Long-range Transboundary Air Pollution in 2023–2024. In particular, it outlines the needs for the Cooperative Programme for Monitoring and Evaluation of the Long-range Transmission of Air Pollutants in Europe (EMEP), in accordance with the Protocol on long-term financing of the EMEP (EMEP Protocol) and provides financial information on core activities under the Convention not covered by the EMEP Protocol. The note was prepared for consideration by the EMEP Steering Body and the Working Group on Effects at their eighth joint session.

The note also presents proposed recommendations to the Executive Body for the Convention, as required by the EMEP Protocol and Executive Body decision 2002/1 as revised by decisions 2018/8, 2019/22 and 2021/4.





Introduction

1. Section I of the present note sets out the financial requirements for 2023–2024 for the Cooperative Programme for Monitoring and Evaluation of the Long-range Transmission of Air Pollutants in Europe (EMEP), as required under article 5 of the 1984 Protocol on the Long-range Transmission of Air Pollutants in Europe (EMEP Protocol). Section II below sets out the requirements for 2023–2024 for the core activities not covered by the EMEP Protocol, as required by the Executive Body for the Convention on Long-range Transboundary Air Pollution in its decision 2002/1 (ECE/EB.AIR/77/Add.1, annex I, as revised by decisions 2018/8, 2019/22 and 2021/4).¹ The note also provides the basis for, and lists, proposed recommendations to the Executive Body, as required by the EMEP Protocol and revised decision 2002/1.

I. Cooperative Programme for Monitoring and Evaluation of the Long-range Transmission of Air Pollutants in Europe

2. The present section reports on use of the 2021 EMEP budget and the status of contributions by Parties, including those that are outstanding. It also presents the proposed schedule of mandatory contributions for 2023, which will be submitted to the Executive Body for approval, calculated on the basis of the 2021 United Nations scale of assessments.² It further presents the details of the EMEP budget for 2023, prepared by the EMEP Steering Body Bureau.

A. Status of the trust fund, contributions in kind and extrabudgetary contributions

3. The contributions paid by the Parties to the Convention for the long-term financing of EMEP as of 31 July 2022 are summarized in table 1 below. They include both the mandatory contributions from the Parties to the EMEP Protocol within the geographic scope of EMEP and the voluntary contributions from Canada and the United States of America, as Parties outside the geographic scope of EMEP. As detailed in table 1 below, payments in cash in 2022 totalling \$1,138,670 were received by 15 August 2022. The expected cash contributions for 2022 to the trust fund from the following Parties were still outstanding: Albania, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czechia, Denmark, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Monaco, North Macedonia, Norway, Portugal, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Russian Federation, Sweden, Türkiye and Ukraine.

4. According to the secretariat's records, the total arrears in cash and in kind by 1 January 2022 stood at \$2,742 while the arrears by 1 January 2021 stood at \$107,723.

5. As of 1 January 2022, the following Parties still had outstanding contributions: Greece (for 2019 (partially)); Liechtenstein (for 2021); Montenegro (for 2021); Portugal (for 2021 (partially)) and Republic of Moldova (for 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021). As of 15 August 2022, Montenegro had paid its arrears.

6. The use of budgeted resources by the EMEP centres in 2021 is presented in table 2 below.

7. In addition to the contributions summarized in table 1 below, voluntary extrabudgetary contributions have been allocated directly to the EMEP centres. In 2021, MSC-West reported in-kind contributions of \$891,680 (including \$75,094 from CIAM and \$147,467 from CEIP), MSC-E an in-kind contribution of \$79,891 (including \$21,048 from

HELCOM and \$58,843 from the OSPAR Commission), and CCC an in-kind contribution of \$12,045.

B. Budget and mandatory contributions for 2023

8. At its forty-first session (Geneva, 6-8 December 2021), the Executive Body approved the detailed use of resources in 2022 in the amount of \$2,358,700, and requested the Steering Body, with the assistance of its Bureau, to present the details of the 2023 budget for approval by the Executive Body at its forty-second session (Geneva, 12–16 December 2022).³ Table 3 below presents the details of the EMEP budget for 2023.

9. At its forty-first session (Geneva, 6-8 December 2021, the Executive Body requested the secretariat to present a revised annex to the EMEP Protocol and a revised scale of mandatory contributions for 2023, based on the most recent United Nations scale of assessments, for consideration at the forty-second session in 2022. A revised schedule of contributions calculated on the basis of the 2021 United Nations scale of assessments is proposed for consideration as set out in Table 4 below. A draft revised annex to the EMEP Protocol is contained in the Annex to this document.

C. Proposed decisions

10. The eighth joint session of the EMEP Steering Body and the Working Group on Effects may wish to:

(a) Take note of the information on the status of contributions to the financing of EMEP provided in the present document and the additional information provided by the secretariat during the session;

(b) Approve the use of resources by the EMEP Centres in 2021, as presented in table 2 below;

(c) Recommend to the Executive Body to agree on the schedule of mandatory contributions from Parties for 2023, as set out in table 4 below;

(d) Call upon the Parties to the EMEP Protocol to consider making voluntary contributions (in kind or in cash through the trust fund) to ensure that the work, especially the difficult tasks required in 2023, can be accomplished as foreseen in the workplan;

(e) Agree on the detailed budget for EMEP for 2023 as presented in table 3 below and submit it to the Executive Body for approval;

(f) Urge Parties that have not yet done so to pay their 2022 contributions in cash to the trust fund and, in 2023, to pay their contributions so that they reach the trust fund in the first half of the year;

(g) Urge Parties owing arrears to pay them in full to the trust fund;

(h) Recommend to the Executive Body to amend the EMEP Protocol by adopting, in accordance with article 4, paragraph 3, of the Protocol, the revised annex set out in the Annex.

II. Core activities not covered by the Protocol on long-term financing of the Cooperative Programme for Monitoring and Evaluation of the Long-range Transmission of Air Pollutants in Europe

11. The present section sets out the financial requirements of the programme centres not funded through the EMEP Protocol. It reports, as specified in revised decision 2002/1, on the contributions from Parties, both in cash and in kind, made in 2021 and 2022. It also presents

a proposed budget for 2023 and provisional budgets for 2024 and 2025 for review and submission to the Executive Body for approval. It also presents a recommended scale of contributions for 2023.

A. Contributions from Parties in 2021 and 2022 and the use of contributions

12. At its forty-first session, the Executive Body decided to adopt a total budget for 2022 of \$2,358,700 for the core activities not funded by the EMEP Protocol.⁴ The secretariat sent a letter to all Parties informing them of the recommended contributions to meet the 2022 budget and inviting them to pay those contributions to the trust fund for effects-oriented activities, as agreed in revised decision 2002/1.

13. Throughout 2021 and in 2022, Parties made cash contributions to the trust fund in accordance with revised decision 2002/1. Some contributions were earmarked for particular programme centres and are listed accordingly. Other contributions were not earmarked and are listed as non-earmarked contributions to the trust fund. Table 5 below (2021 contributions in cash, earmarked and non-earmarked, towards financing the core activities under the Convention) and table 6 below (2022 contributions in cash, earmarked and non-earmarked, towards financing the core activities under the Convention, as of 15 August 2022) also identify the contributions recommended to Parties by the Executive Body, as well as the actual contributions made.

14. For 2021, a total of 37 Parties made contributions totalling \$2,421,661, of which \$1,717,298 were contributions in kind directly to the centres and \$704,363 were contributions in cash to the trust fund.

15. As of 15 August 2022, as allowed under revised decision 2002/1, Italy, Norway, Sweden, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland informed the secretariat of their contributions in kind for 2021 and 2022. These contributions are presented in tables 7 and 8 below. The use of earmarked and non-earmarked cash contributions for the period 2013–2022 is presented in table 9 below. Table 10 below includes the proposed international coordination costs for 2023, while table 11 below presents recorded contributions to partially fund the effects-oriented activities in 2021.

16. As contributions are received throughout the year, with no advance notice of the amounts to be received, it is not possible to plan for contracts with the centres. Contracts for the current year are drawn up on the basis of contributions made by Parties to the trust fund received in the preceding year. Non-earmarked contributions are divided equally between the centres.

17. In addition to the cash contributions, additional contributions were made by the lead countries of the programmes and by the countries hosting programme centres. A number of Parties also provided additional support through hosting task force meetings, workshops and/or expert meetings.

B. Budget and contributions required for 2023 and provisional budgets for 2024 and 2025

18. At its forty-first session, the Executive Body decided that the budget for financing the core activities not funded by the EMEP Protocol, would provisionally be \$2,358,700 (including 3 per cent programme support costs) in 2023 and \$2,358,700 in 2024.⁵ The details of the budget (international coordination costs) are presented in table 11 below.

19. The Executive Body invited the secretariat to provide the information on the amount of contributions made to the trust fund for effects-oriented activities as of 30 November 2022, and to make it available to the Executive Body at its forty-second session and to use the

amount as a basis to co-fund the effects-oriented activities in 2023. The Executive Body encouraged Parties to make contributions to the trust fund before 30 November each year.⁶

20. The Executive Body requested the secretariat to present a revised recommended scale of contributions based on the most recent United Nations scale of assessment, for consideration at its forty-second session in 2022. A revised scale of contributions calculated on the basis of the 2021 United Nations scale of assessments is set out in table 12 below.

C. Proposed decisions

21. At their eighth joint session, the EMEP Steering Body and the Working Group on Effects may wish to:

(a) Note the cash contributions made to the trust fund for effects-oriented activities in 2021 and 2022, but also to express disappointment at the lack of response from many Parties;

(b) Approve the 2023 essential international coordination costs of \$2,358,700 for different elements of the effects-oriented activities and the provisional cost estimate of \$2,358,700 for 2024 and 2025, for submission to the Executive Body;

(c) Recommend to the Executive Body to agree on the recommended scale of contributions to the trust fund for core activities not covered by the EMEP Protocol for 2023, as outlined in table 12 below, and to revise decision 2002/1 to reflect the new scale of contributions based on the 2021 United Nations scale of assessments;

(d) Invite all Parties to provide the recommended contributions to the trust fund before 30 November each year;

(e) Note with appreciation the essential support provided to the Convention and its bodies by lead countries, countries hosting coordinating centres and those countries organizing meetings, as well as countries that fund activities of their national focal centres/ points and the active participation of national experts.
