New Urban Agenda




Participation of all urban residents (para. 87, 88, 90, 91 and 92)

New governance strategies for urban design


An initiative, mainly in European context, exploring how the **soft, non-regulatory powers** of the state can shape decisions that help deliver **better-designed places**.

a toolbox for integrated participatory urban planning




An action-oriented toolbox to develop better and more integrated participatory planning processes, giving the possibility to governments to customise their own planning processes based on their vision, budget and time constrains.

UN-Habitat Environmental and Social Safeguards System 3.0

- Consider the impact of spatial planning and large-scale infrastructure on ecosystems and well-being from the outset of programmes
- Integrate the principles of ecosystem services and nature-based solutions in newly developed infrastructure and spatial plans
