<p><i>Poverty is a complex phenomenon. As a concept, it is defined and understood in different ways. The choice of a specific definition of poverty and the measurement method used determines the results of the assessment. As a consequence, it may have an impact on the design of programmes, formulated within the framework of social policy, aimed at reducing this phenomenon.</i></p> <p><i>The intention of the presentation will focus on the interpretation of data on the extent of poverty (in this case in Poland) calculated using different measurement methods. Most attention will be devoted to discussing the relationship between indicators of so-called objective and subjective poverty.</i></p>
