Project title: Preparation Phase of the project "Improving the energy efficiency of the global building supply chain industry and its products to deliver high performance buildings"

Expected timing/ duration: January – July 2023

Objective and brief summary of the project:

The objective of the Preparation Phase is to develop a complete project document for the project "Improving the energy efficiency (EE) of the global building supply chain industry and its products to deliver high performance buildings" with all accompanying materials that outlines concrete, result-oriented activities of all stakeholders, takes account national circumstances of the beneficiary countries and responds to their needs in an effective manner while remaining consistent in terms of common outputs and outcomes, and ensures alignment across the board on the project log-frame. The project "Improving the energy efficiency of the global building supply chain industry and its products to deliver high performance buildings" aims to develop a strong foundation of proven best practice methods and focused technical capacity that beneficiary countries can build upon to improve building energy performance and reduce embodied carbon and energy to support their development and achievement of enhanced national determined contributions (NDC) targets. Main outcomes of the project: NDC enhance improvements in EE in buildings and the building sector's supply chain and specify how these targets support the Paris Agreement; countries have clear and interconnected strategies to achieve NDC targets, including institution and dissemination of best practices and capacity building; concrete measures for improving performance of the building sector supply chain and its end products are implemented, with progress tracked across a range of the quality-of-life indicators. Emphasizing scalability and replication, the project will focus specifically on improving the effectiveness of the building sector supply chain to improve the complete lifecycle performance of buildings. By focusing on the building sector supply chain, the project will address the embodied energy and carbon of buildings and ensure that buildings' operational components are designed and installed to operate optimally. A core element of the project will be to engage actively with the beneficiary countries to develop their relevant public and private sector capacities to ensure the long-term replication and upscaling of the project activities.

UNECE will be in charge of the overall coordination of implementation of the Preparation Phase across all activities and all Implementing Partners. The Implementing Partners for the Preparation Phase comprise the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) offices in seven beneficiary countries (Armenia, Georgia, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Tajikistan, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan), United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). The Implementing Partners for the full project additionally include UNEP-CCC (Climate Change Center), Green Building Alliance (GBA), Institute for Energy Efficiency in Production (EEP), and Passive House Institute (PHI). The objective of the project will be achieved by implementing the following activities:

- A1.1. Review baseline situation including legal and institutional frameworks for buildings, to inform on existing gaps and specific requirements for project implementation;
- A1.2. Map key stakeholders and project partners and identify their roles in the project, conduct appraisal missions to validate the baseline situations and engage local stakeholders and secure their involvement in the project's activities;
- A1.3. Prepare a complete project document;
- A1.4. Conduct validation workshop for the detailed national implementation plans with stakeholders.

Expected results of the project:

EA1. Development of project document for improving the energy efficiency of the global building supply chain industry and its products to deliver high performance buildings

Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

The beneficiary countries are Armenia, Georgia, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Tajikistan, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan. The primary target groups are entities dealing with policy development and implementation in the area of energy efficiency and construction, including ministries, government agencies, and regulatory authorities, domestic and international financial institutions, academia, industry associations, project developers, architects, designers, contractors, and energy consultants. Additional stakeholders can include community representatives, civil society organizations, international donors and the media. The project will target other stakeholders in the building supply chain at the national and local levels.

Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

The project is directly linked to the objective of the Subprogramme 5 "Sustainable Energy" "to ensure secure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all and to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and the carbon footprint of the energy sector in the region" of the UNECE Proposed programme budget for 2023.
