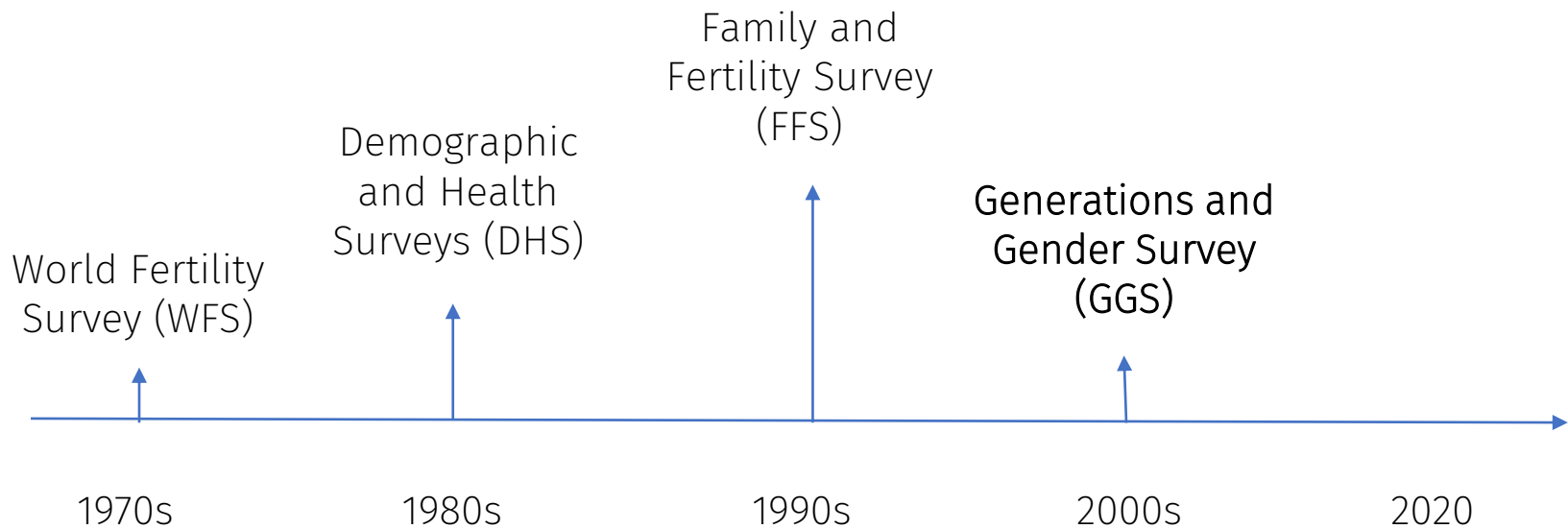

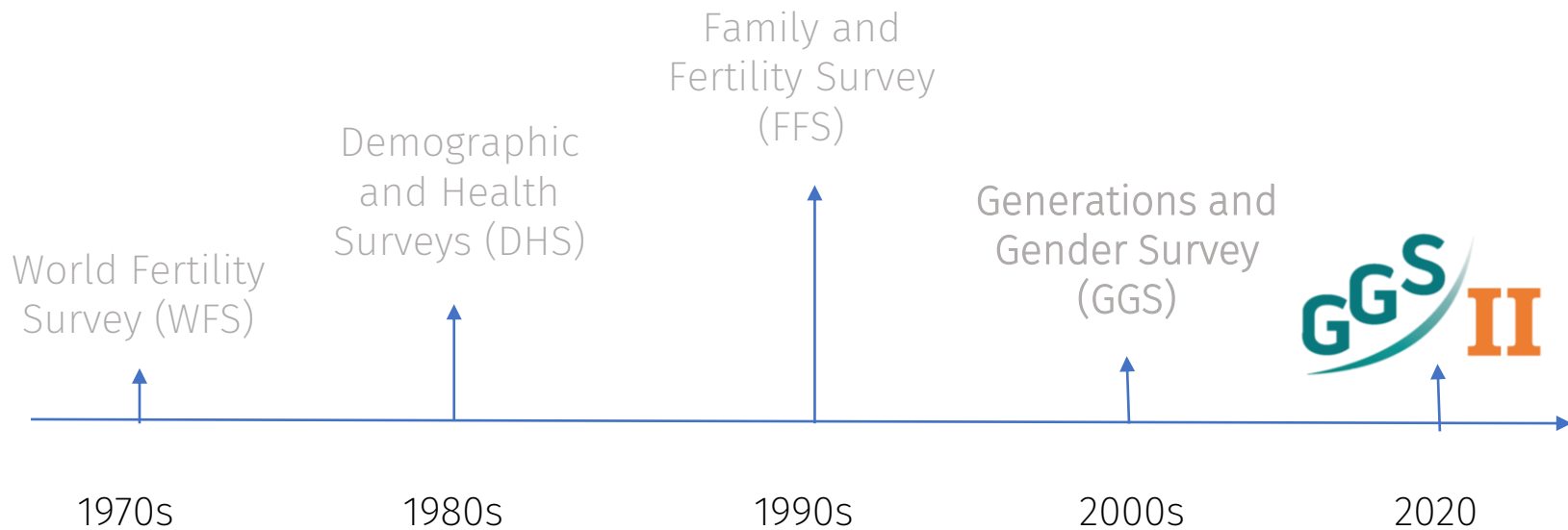
Research infrastructure for high quality data on population and family dynamics

Mixed-mode data collection

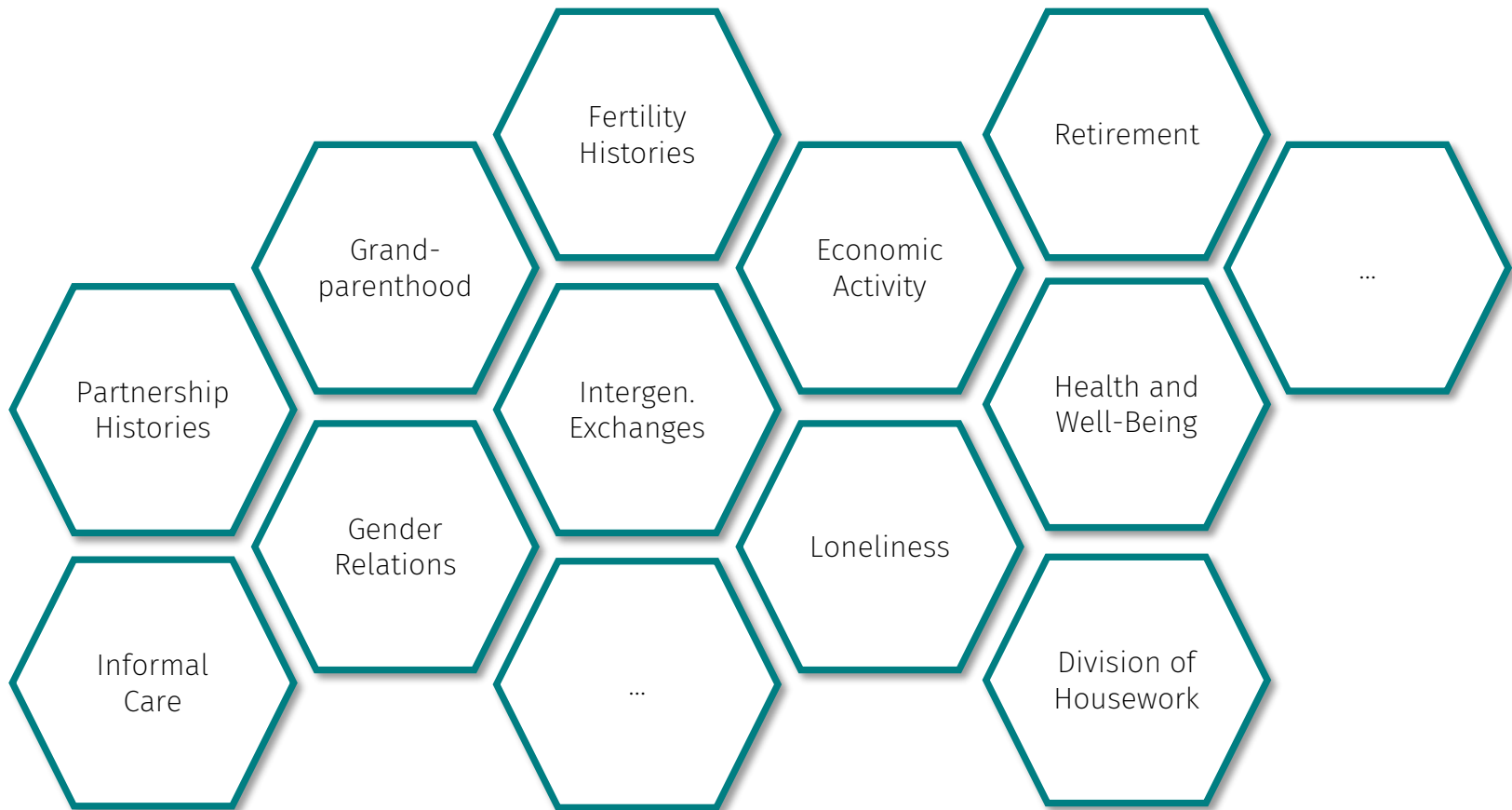
