GOVERNING BODIES

Steering Committee meeting in August 2022

- Eligibility of proposals received for the 2022 Call for proposal
- Approval of a total amount of USD 4,000,000 to fund 12 projects
- Endorsement of the 2023-2025 multi-annual budget of the UNRSF Secretariat
- Endorsement of the reformulated UNRSF logical framework

Steering Committee meeting in December 2022

- Financial and Programmatic Overview of the UN Road Safety Fund
- Call for proposals 2023 – strategic priorities, timeline, total funding to be awarded (USD 4,000,000);
- Presentation on the option of direct access by civil society to Call for proposals

Advisory Board meeting in December 2022

- Visibility: Raise awareness and profile global road safety as an international development assistance priority
- Resource Mobilization: Ensure sustainable financing to enable the Fund to deliver on its 2030 mandate

UN Road Safety Fund Projects

- 36 approved projects in 5 regions in 46 countries
- 25 projects currently under implementation
- 62 project proposal received through the call for proposal 2022
- 11 projects through the call for proposal 2022

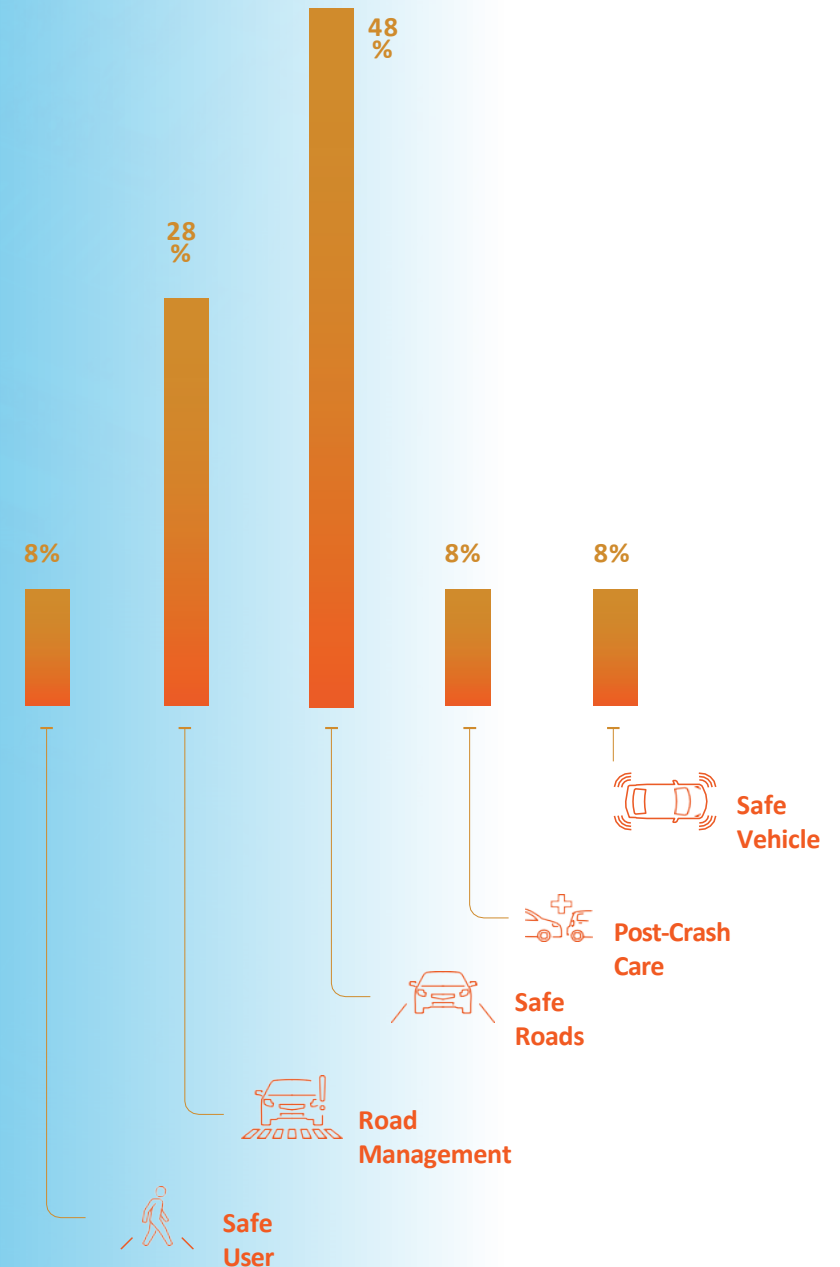

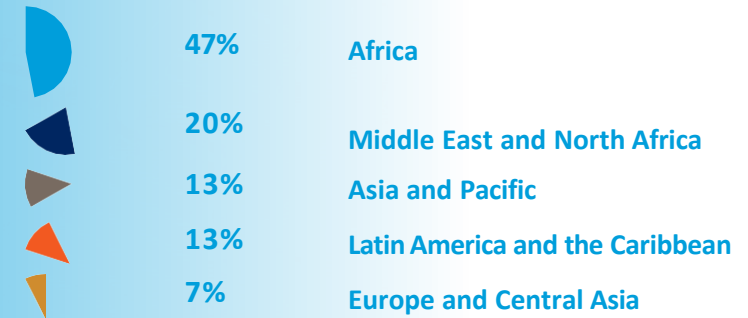
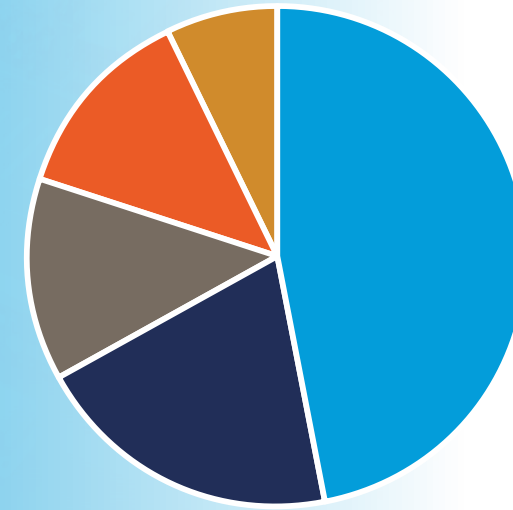
UN Road Safety Fund Projects

UN Road Safety Fund Projects

How UNRSF is Improving Road Safety (as at mid 2022)

SAFE ROAD USER BEHAVIOR

E.g., in Brazil, the Fund supported the government in the State of Para to train over 300 traffic enforcement officers on breathalyzer and speed enforcement best practices resulting in a decrease in road deaths over 1 year.

POST CRASH CARE

E.g., in Azerbaijan and Bangladesh, the Fund supported the governments to design and roll out a model operational emergency management system for timely and effective post-crash care for road traffic injury victims.

VEHICLE SAFETY

E.g., in the 15 West African ECOWAS countries, the Fund supported the governments to design and adopt a regional imported vehicle directive which improves the emissions and vehicle safety standards.

ROAD DESIGN

E.g., in Ethiopia, the Fund supported the government to design and adopt a national policy for safe non-motorized street design. There are 69 cities implementing it and 7km of cycle lanes already constructed.

ROAD SAFETY MANAGEMENT

E.g., in Cote d'Ivoire and Senegal, the Fund supported the governments to establish the first-ever multi-sectoral steering committee comprised of national road safety data coordinators across all key ministries.



FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES
