

#### **Youth Position Paper**

- Presented at the THE PEP High-level Ministerial Meeting
- > Three virtual Youth Forums, gathering insights, ideas and visions of 27 young people across Europe
- ➤ Opinions and visions for mobility management, active mobility and a safe, affordable and reliable (public) transport system
- > To lead the transformation towards a "clean, safe, healthy and inclusive mobility and transport for the happiness and prosperity of everyone"









#### Why we urgently need change

Negative impacts on children and youth related to transport and mobility:

- > Child traffic accidents
- ➤ Noise and air pollution
- > Lack of physical activity
- ➤ Lack of mental stimulation during car trips
- > Lack of opportunities of education or emancipation (for youth)

According to the WHO every year over 1.35 million people die from road traffic accidents. Most of the casualties are between five and 29 years old.







#### What do children and young people need?

- > Active mobility to combat physical inactivity
- > Nature and a healthy environment
- > Safe travel and safe public play zones
- > Independent mobility in particular in rural regions, where young people without a driver's license have difficulties getting from one place to another
- **→** Participation

- > Taking action to implement the Vienna Declaration
