Questions to Malta

The Committee acknowledges that in its 2021 NIR Malta indicated that dissemination of national PRTR data is done through the E-PRTR website (http://prtr.ec.europa.eu) and that a National system allows access to parts of the PRTR data, not further elaborating on whether the system is fully meeting the requirements for national PRTR systems under the Protocol in particular in terms of searchability and accessibility. The Committee in its 2021 synthesis report had also addressed this topic with a chapter on National pollutant release and transfer registers in the European Union member States (see ECE/MP.PRTR/2021/10, paras. 237-244). Malta mentioned that it fulfils its obligation through the E-PRTR and that the PRTR data is also available on its national geoportal. In this regard the Committee wishes to ask the below questions.
