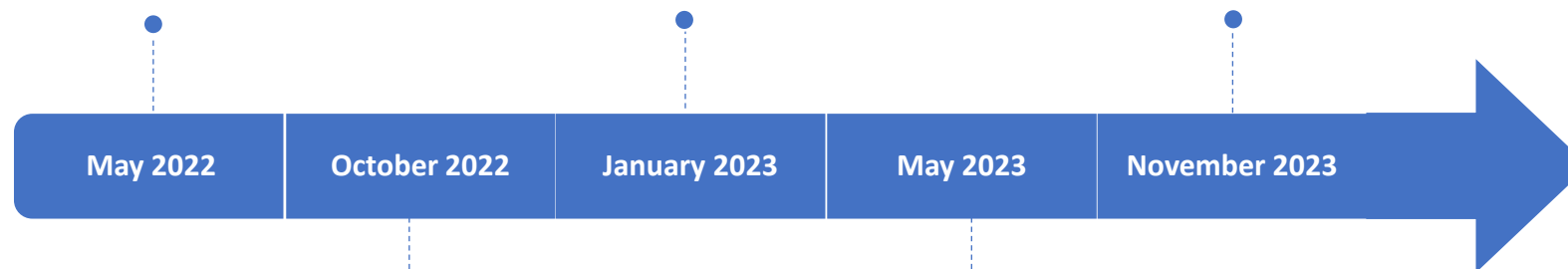

Renewal of mandate & terms of reference



New mandate and ToR of WGEMA take into account:

- Recommendations made during recent meetings of Working Group and CEP
- Current mandate and terms of reference & a survey conducted during the 24th session of the Working Group on the newly proposed mandate and terms of reference
- 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
- Outcomes of Ninth Environment for Europe Ministerial Conference
- Other relevant policies such as MEAs, including UNECE Conventions, Paris Agreement, Sendai Framework for DRR, and transition to a circular economy
- Digital agendas
- Common approach of UNECE-EEA-UNEP
- Questionnaire & publication *Sharing our vision for pan-European region: Setting strategic goals & objectives for the Working Group, up to 2030*
- Feedback received from UNECE member States and international partners in 2022

Continued and growing relevance of Working Group



- Natural resources not used sustainably, and situation is projected to worsen in coming decades due to population growth, agriculture, enhanced energy production and consumption & due to climate change etc..
 - Still significant data and knowledge gaps to measure progress towards policy targets (SDGs, MEAs, Sendai, Global Biodiversity Framework, etc.)
 - UNEP publication *Measuring Progress: Environment and the SDGs* reports that
“unfortunately ... our comprehension of the environmental dimension of the SDGs is lagging. Our limited capacities to collect, disseminate and effectively use environmental data have hindered our holistic understanding of the environment and the effect on it of socioeconomic factors”.
 - Also, the publication *Europe’s Environment: The Seventh Pan-European Environmental Assessment* has identified various monitoring and data gaps
- Environmental monitoring and assessment, including for emerging themes, are therefore critical for measuring and monitoring progress regarding policy targets and to derive needed actions & measures

New mandate & terms of reference



Mandate of Working Group:

- Serve as **environmental monitoring, knowledge and assessment network for whole UNECE region**
- **Serve as platform to exchange good practices & information**, develop action plans and strengthen initiatives on environmental monitoring- and assessment-related areas, to **aid informed decision-making in support of transition to sustainable development and a green and circular economy**



New mandate & terms of reference



Overall objectives of Working Group (in cooperation with partners):

- To enable informed environmental decision-making through regular monitoring, assessment and reporting
- To support the implementation of the outcomes of the Ninth Environment for Europe Ministerial Conference, implementation of MEAs and global policy frameworks including the Sendai Framework for DRR and the Global Biodiversity Framework.



Planned programme areas, activities and outputs



Programme area 1: Support development of environmental monitoring and information systems:

- Support institutional strengthening and legislative improvement
- Promote use of new technologies and tools
- Regularly evaluate performance of environmental monitoring and information systems in line with SEIS principles and pillars & open data
- Contribute to implementing main environmental monitoring- and assessment-related outcomes of 9th Environment for Europe Ministerial Conference
- Contribute to closure of monitoring gaps in Europe and Central Asia

Programme area 2: Support the development of regular pan-European environmental assessments and regular state-of-the-environment reporting

- Bring together experts from partner organizations and other interested parties to discuss and oversee the 8th pan-European environmental assessment

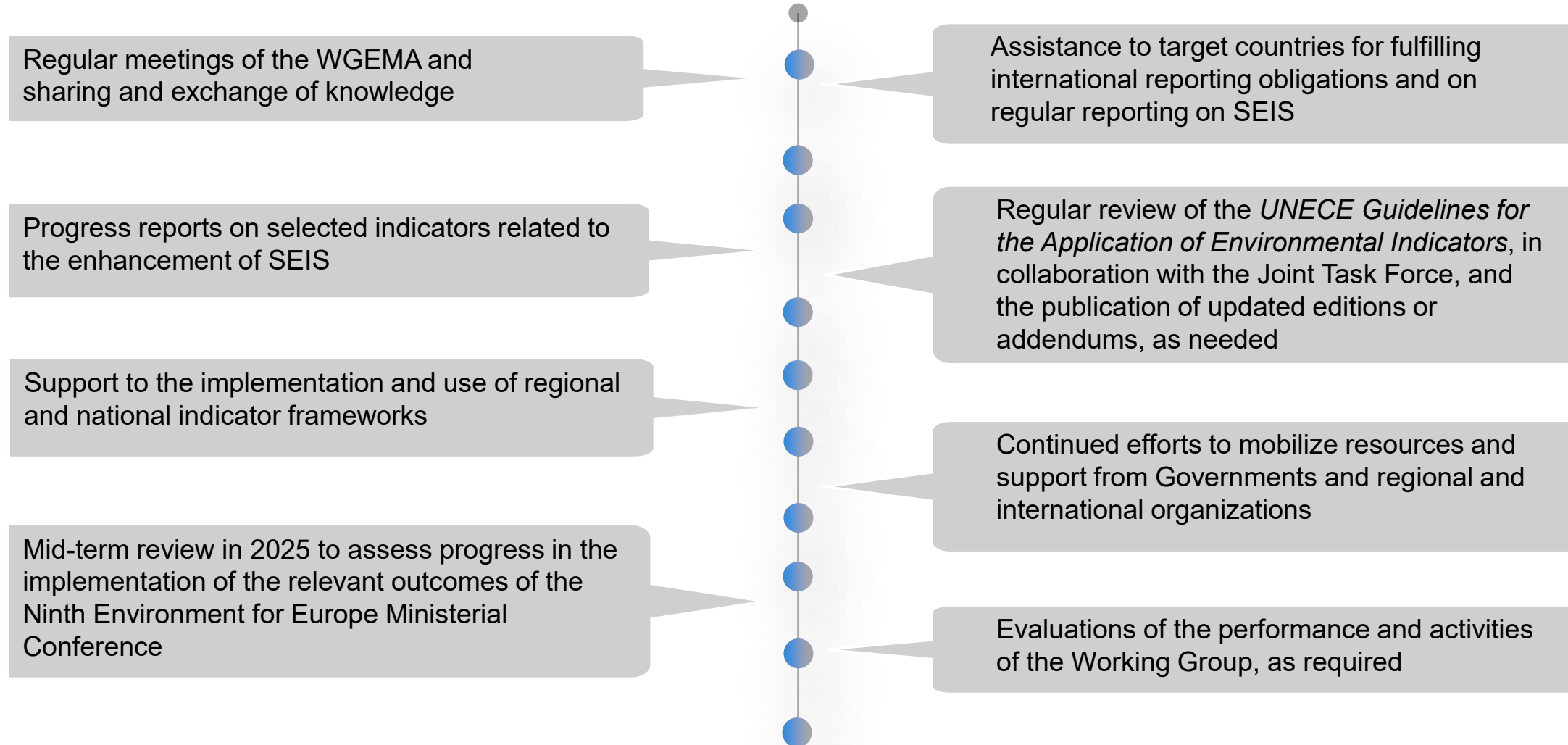
Planned programme areas, activities and outputs

Timetable and Methods of work



Timetable:

- Annual timetable of activities shall be prepared
- Committee on Environmental Policy shall be informed on the progress of work of WGEMA.
- Mandate of WGEMA will be reviewed and amended by CEP in its regular session in 2028.

Methods of work:

- WGEMA shall meet at least once annually (besides communicating through email and other electronic collaborative platforms in the period between meetings)
- Additional meetings, workshops and capacity-development activities will be organized subject to the availability of funding.

Membership & Secretariat support & resources



Membership:

- WGEMA shall be composed of members from all UNECE member States (representatives of national institutions dealing with environmental monitoring, knowledge and assessment).
- WGEMA shall also involve representatives of partner organizations, such as other international and regional organizations, programmes and policies & MEAs
- WGEMA shall elect a chair and two vice-chairs for a term of up to two years. The chair and vice-chairs shall be eligible for re-election for one additional term.

Secretariat support and resources:

- WGEMA to be serviced by UNECE secretariat, supported by UNEP & EEA. The UNECE secretariat will work closely with interested partners, such as the European Commission and OECD.
- Donors will be invited to provide support for the Working Group's activities.

- Support to fundraising
- Provision of guidance during implementation of the activity
- Reporting on progress to WGEMA (or Committee on Environmental Policy).
