

# **MPD: Background**

- Mobile Phone Data is being explored by many governments as a source for transport planning and/or statistics production
- Most examples show MPD used for transport planning, rather than official statistics
- Why? Promising data source but questions remain about:
  - Cost
  - Sustainability
  - Lack of common methodology
  - Accuracy and completeness

# **MPD: Uses**

- Road traffic: difficult to produce real number of vehicles (and counters already give good information)
- Public transport passengers (sometimes available at high degree of detail from cameras or turnstiles)
- Walking and cycling (lack of empirical data to benchmark)
- Main potential seems to be Origin-Destination matrices (travel surveys often not detailed enough to have these for small areas)



## **Handbook Draft**



- Handbook goal is to help countries get started
- As much practical info as possible
- Aim was not to repeat other sources, but still give some technical details on processing data. Other manuals are linked to where relevant.
- Multiple models available (processing done by MNO and passed to NSO aggregated; NSO processing data directly)
