- request to add SOGI content to the ACS came from the Department of Justice
- need to adapt terminology not only for gender identity and sexual orientation categories, but also for nongendered relationship categories

Switzerland: situation and recent developments 1/2

- Legal premises
- o only two legal categories, but
- 1.1.2022 → facilitated change to the sex recorded in the civil register
- Exchange 20.1.2022: FSO ↔ lesbian & gay associations
- Data and stats
- Swiss Health Survey (2007 → sexual behaviour, 2007 → sexual orientation, 2022 gender identity)
- new results of register data published 20.3.2023


 (1.1.2022 → changes in sex, 1.7.2022 → marriages same-sex couples)



Switzerland: situation and recent developments 2/2

- 2022 Report on collecting data on discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity
 - → quantitative research not suitable, qualitative first
 - → however measures to improve the data situation
