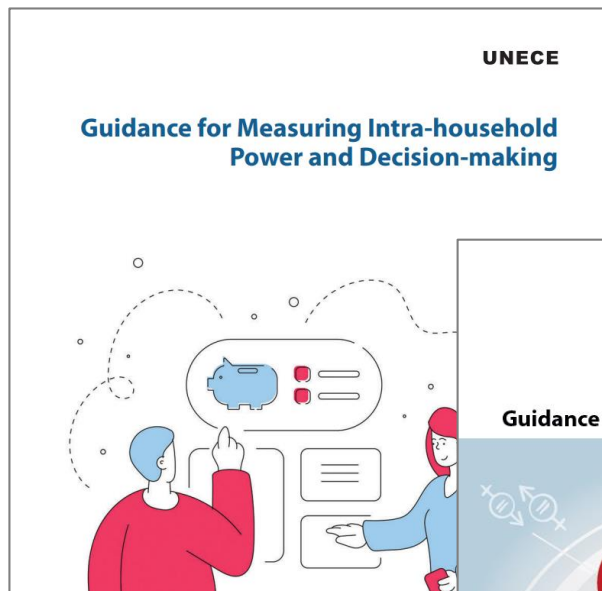

The Conference of European Statisticians (CES) Steering Group on Gender Statistics has developed practical guidance for data producers towards measuring the ongoing and longer-term gendered impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Guidance proposes indicators and survey questions and offers advice on the key methodological considerations for data collection and dissemination in four areas: paid and unpaid work, health, violence against women, and the digital gender divide.



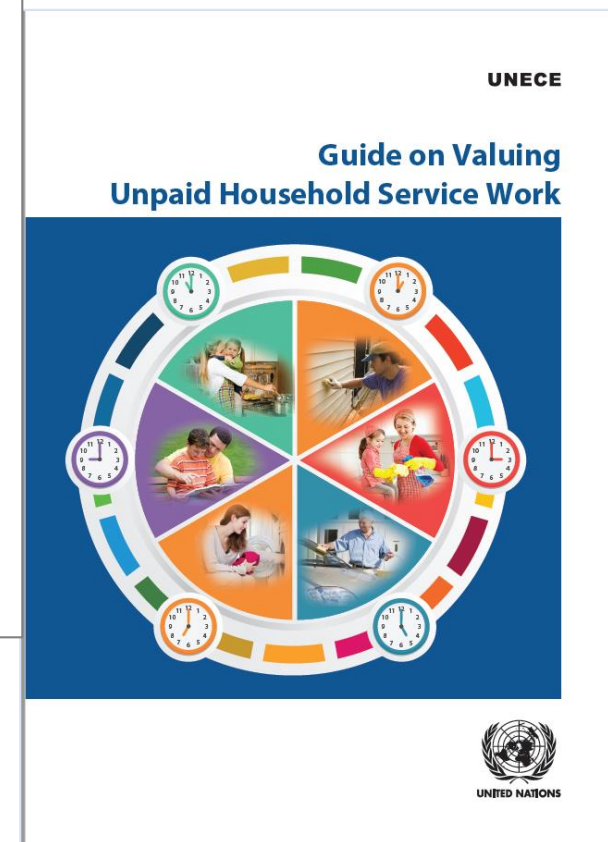
