Switzerland	<p>In 2021, the SLFS survey changed from being a survey conducted purely by telephone to a multi-mode survey (via internet and telephone) with priority given to the internet survey. In addition, the 2021 questionnaire was modified to comply with the new Eurostat regulations, also in force from January 2021. For certain results, these changes have led to a break in the series between 2020 and 2021.</p>	Apprentices are excluded.
Italy	2021: break in time series due to regulation (EU) 2019/1700 of the European Parliament and of the Council. Comparable data for the new series starts from 2018.	

Finland	2021: Due to methodological changes, there is a break in time series. The time series is adjusted backwards in accordance with the current regulation ie. time series here is comparable.
