Procedural vs Substantive

 Each Party shall promote the application of the principles of this Convention in international environmental decision-making processes and within the framework of international organizations in matters relating to the environment.

Trade Concerns	Environmental Concerns
Economic Growth	Import of banned substances
Europe export of goods	Impact on Biodiversity
Reducing tariffs	Pricing of exhaustible resources
Reducing non-tariff barriers	CO2 transport emissions
Increase competition	Tariff reductions environmental goods
Consumer choice	Risk of ISDS

Participation avenues


- Ministerial contacts → more interlinkages
- Sustainability Impact Assessments → early
- Civil Society Dialogues → transparency
- Domestic Advisory Groups → formal power
- Protests → can be avoided
