Key outcomes of MOP-6


- **Broad and high-level participation**: 300 participants from over 45 countries, over 20 ministers, state secretaries and ambassadors
- MOP elected Hungary as its Chair, new members of the <u>Bureau</u> and <u>Compliance Committee</u> also elected

High-level session

- Focused on strengthening resilience of WASH and health services in times of climate change and pandemics – Protocol as a framework for integrated response to crises
- Conclusions brought forward by Hungary, as MOP Chair, to the 2023 UN Water Conference

Countries' progress towards accession

- Montenegro acceded to the Protocol in 2019 27th Party
- Four countries in the process of accession (Italy, Kazakhstan, North Macedonia, Uzbekistan)
- UN Secretary General stressing the call for accession in his message to the MOP – all countries of the pan-European region to ratify the Protocol and strive for full implementation







Cooperation between the Protocol and the Water Convention

Increasing resilience to climate change

- Jointly organized Global Workshop on building climate resilience through improving water management and sanitation at national and transboundary levels (29-31 March 2021)
- Possible joint events to be organized in future triennium thematic focus on water and disaster risk reduction, water scarcity, financing climate adaptation

Cooperation under the framework of National Policy Dialogues

 NPDs carried out in 2021-2022 with the aim of strengthening water governance and integrated water resource management in Eastern Europe, the Caucasus and Central Asia. To continue in future triennium

Exchange of experience between Protocol Compliance Committee and Convention Implementation Committee

<u>NB</u>: Strategic discussion at the Protocol's Bureau meeting in May 2023. Global relevance of PWH, increasing interest from European Commission, need to build partnerships. <u>Vision for the Protocol and its future development under preparation</u>
