## I. Introduction

1. At its eleventh meeting, the Bureau of THE PEP Steering Committee requested the secretariat to prepare a detailed programme of work, showing work accomplished over the previous years (2009–2010) and expected outputs in the forthcoming years (2010–2011) (ECE/AC.21/SC/2009/8–EUR/09/5088363/8/annex. A draft programme of work was considered by THE PEP Bureau at its twelfth meeting in Rome in July 2010. The Committee is invited to consider and adopt the following draft programme of work, intended to take stock of recent and ongoing activities and to guide the work of THE PEP in the coming years.

## II. Background

2. The Third High-level Meeting on Transport, Health and Environment (22–23 January 2009, Amsterdam) adopted the Amsterdam Declaration, including THE PEP workplan for 2009–2014 which support national action and international cooperation (ECE/AC.21/2009/2–EUR/09/5086385/2/annex). This workplan is based upon and in line with four priority goals, enshrined in the Amsterdam Declaration, which commit United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and World Health Organization Regional Office for Europe (WHO/Europe) member States to pursue integrated policies aimed at achieving safe, efficient, environment- and health-friendly transport.
