Policy options document addressing the conclusions of the GP review

Context

- Dec 2019: Launch of the AGP review (EB39) (EB Decision 2019/4)
- Dec 2022: Conclusion and completion of the AGP review
 (EB 42) (EB Decision 2022/4, paragraph 6)

Request WGSR to address conclusions of the AGP review report: development of policy options by new expert group (EB Decision 2022/4, paragraphs 8 and 9)

Dec 2023: EB to consider policy options and take appropriate action (EB43)
 (EB Decision 2022/4, paragraph 11)

EB decision 2022/4, paragraph 9

Decides that an <u>ad hoc group of experts</u> should be convened by the Chair of the Working Group on Strategies and Review. The tasks of the ad hoc group include:

- (a) <u>development of policy options</u> to address the conclusions of the review, including consideration of the option of a revision of the Gothenburg Protocol, as amended in 2012 and options for addressing conclusions related to the technical annexes, and <u>including recommendations</u> for next steps and future work;
- (b) sharing the policy options with the Working Group on Strategies and Review for input in preparation for and at sessions of the WGSR in 2023, and, in the event of only one WGSR, that a first draft of the ad hoc group's report is made available through the secretariat to the national focal points for their input latest by the end of spring 2023;
- (c) <u>further elaborating the policy options taking due consideration of the input</u> received.

- To provide objective and factual information (expert judgement)
- To provide expert input to the EB to allow EB making an informative decision on appropriate next steps, potentially to launch a formal negotiation process
- ➤ To be used as one of the sources of information alongside other sources of information (e.g. review material developed in recent years)
- To be submitted to the EB for consideration, not adoption

Chapter 2 - Description of policy options

- Options are grouped into following 4 main approaches
- Each approach as well options within them can be standalone or used in combination

- 1 No revision of amended Gothenburg Protocol (AGP) (continue with ratifying and implementing AGP)
- 2 Revision of AGP
 - (a) Targeted revisions of TA IV-XI
 - (b) Comprehensive revisions of Protocol text and TA
- 3 New instrument(s)/measure(s)
 - (a) Develop non-binding instrument(s)/measure(s)
 - (b) Develop binding instrument(s)/measure(s)
- 4 Cross-cutting: Enhance:
 - (a) Capacity-building
 - (b) Awareness-raising
 - (c) Cooperation outside the Convention
 - (d) Other support

Approach 1 - no revision of AGP

- Continue with ratification and implementation of present AGP
- > Focus on reporting, compliance review, exchange of information ...
- Focus on cross-cutting actions (capacity building, ...)
- > Further potential initiatives
 - ✓ Continue to improve emission inventories
 - ✓ Operational improvements to flexibility provisions (guidance)
 - ✓ Updating existing / developing new guidance documents
 - ✓ Address CH₄ through scientific work

Approach 2(a) - Targeted revisions of TA

- Amendments to one or more of Technical Annexes IV- XI for which the use of the expedited amendment procedure is optional
- Amendments can include
 - ✓ Improvements to current flexibilities (e.g. timescales Annex VII)
 - ✓ New flexibilities / different approaches
 - ✓ Specific amendments to TA (simplification, derogations)
 - ✓ Restructuring TA / separate sections for EECCA/WB/TR
 - ✓ Focus on requirements for key categories / new installations.

Approach 2(b) - Comprehensive revision

- > A comprehensive revision of text and Technical Annexes can include
 - ✓ New emission reduction commitments for current set of pollutants
 - ✓ Enhancing action on NH₃ (amend Annex IX: strengthening existing requirements, expanding scope)
 - ✓ Introducing requirements on CH₄ (ERCs, TA, ...)
 - ✓ Expanding requirements on BC (ERCs, reporting, other ...)
 - Removing barriers to ratification and implementation
 - Introducing new approaches (staged ratification, phased commitments
 - ✓ Automatic incorporation of ELVs in TA upon ratification
 - ✓ Removing (replacing) TA
 - ✓ Relevant updates to articles

Approach 3(a) - Non-binding instrument

- > A new non binding instrument / voluntary action can include
 - ✓ Voluntary programmes such as former BACA initiative
 - ✓ Framework of voluntary targets for additional action on air pollution (cfr. Biodiversity)
 - ✓ Additional voluntary action to fulfil Global CH₄ pledge; link to other agreements ...
 - ✓ Moving focus to a more facilitating role for the Convention; focus
 on implementation
 - ✓ Building in cooperation with existing programmes from WB, CCAC ...
- Possible role for FICAP

Approach 3(b) - Binding instrument

- > A new binding instrument (to replace / complement AGP) can include
 - ✓ New protocol with broader scope / different content / structure
 - ✓ Framework protocol (with secondary implementing measures)
 - ✓ Sector-based protocol (harmonizing sectors)
 - ✓ Single pollutant protocol (e.g. for CH₄)
 - Phased approach protocol... (phased progress towards overall objectives in line with countries' capacities)

Approach 4 - Cross-cutting

- > (4a) Enhance capacity building
 - ✓ Update needs assessment
 - ✓ Address capacity needs/gaps (WP, TF mandates, ...)
- > (4b) Enhance Awareness raising
 - ✓ Review effectiveness of current communication and outreach
 - ✓ Improve as needed (campaigns, national dialogues, HL events ...)
- > (4c) Enhance cooperation with
 - ✓ WHO, UNFCCC, IPCC, CCAC, UNEP, SCPP ...
- > (4d) Other support
 - ✓ Increase voluntary contributions
 - ✓ New funding mechanism to support implementation
 - ✓ Outreach to financial institutions

Summary table chapter 2

- Provides overview of relationship between main themes of GP review conclusions and policy approaches
- Shows to what extent the policy options can address the following themes
 - ✓ Emission reduction commitments
 - ✓ Technical Annexes /Guidance documents
 - ✓ NH3
 - ✓ BC
 - ✓ CH4
 - ✓ Protocol related barriers
 - Other barriers
 - Emission inventories
 - ✓ Other issues (synergies, NT-measures, action outside ECE)

Summary table chapter 3

- Provides a comparison of policy approaches on the basis of following criteria
 - ✓ Level of ambition and feasibility to implement (effectiveness)
 - ✓ Level of effort to pursue particular approach
 - Expected timeline to implement particular approach
 - ✓ Costs and resources
 - ✓ Level of complexity (legal complexity)
 - ✓ Multi-pollutant / multi-effect approach
 - ✓ Level playing field
 - ✓ Potential to encourage ratification and implementation
 - ✓ Future proof (relevance)

Recommendations

- 57. To address and respond to the conclusions of the Gothenburg Protocol review, Convention Parties should consider a comprehensive revision of the text and annexes of the amended Gothenburg Protocol (approach 2b) with due regard to removing barriers to ratification and implementation, while also working to achieve further emission reductions and to begin this work in 2024 at the 62nd session of the Working Group on Strategies and Review.
- 58. In undertaking a comprehensive revision of the Gothenburg Protocol the revision process could include consideration of the following key priority areas:
 - Update emission reduction commitments for existing pollutants;
 - Consider new specific emission requirements for black carbon and/or as component of PM;
 - Address ammonia emissions with stricter emission requirements, and more broadly;
 - Address methane as an ozone precursor;
 - Update the technical annexes of the Protocol, including through simplification, restructuring and/or removal of the annexes, as appropriate
 - Consider further and/or different flexibilities and approaches to address barriers to ratification and implementation, including a phased approach (to ratification or commitments).
 - Further consider synergies with other policy areas, such as climate and energy, and work closely with other forums addressing these issues.
- 59. In parallel, whichever approach is chosen, any activities that do not require opening formal negotiations should be given appropriate consideration by the Executive Body and, subject to availability of resources, be added to future workplans of the Convention. Prioritisation of these activities can be determined on the basis of an updated needs assessment (see paragraph 19(a)).
