- GGP is an international research infrastructure focusing on population and family dynamics.
- Founded in 2000 under the umbrella of UNECE. Since 2009, headquarters are in the Netherlands (NIDI) but collaboration with UNECE remains.
- Our mission is to provide high-quality and crossnational data on scientific and societal challenges related to demographic change.




## **Generations and Gender Survey**

### **Key features of GGS**

- Broad age range (18-79) allows collecting information about entire life course
- Large sample size makes it possible to study numerical minorities, uncommon events, and disaggregate data
- Multidisciplinary questionnaire captures a wide range of societal and scientific topics
- Wide geographical coverage allows to compare countries
- Longitudinal study design allows to follow people in time and see how their lives change





## Panel design in GGS



#### Questions that can ONLY be answered with panel data

- Realization of intentions
- Track changes in situations of (vulnerable) families
- Work and family dynamics
- Evolution of gender (in)equalities
- Causes and consequences of intergenerational exchange



Data from GGS can contribute to a better match between the realities of people's needs and the public policies designed to support them
