**Project title:** Strengthening capacities of UNECE member States to develop evidence-based policy measures to meet the commitments under MIPAA/RIS and the 2022 Rome Ministerial Declaration Ageing (Ageing - Phase 4)

Expected timing/ duration: January 2024 – December 2025

## Objective and brief summary of the project:

The objective of the project is to strengthen the capacities of UNECE member States to address the challenges and opportunities of population ageing. In 2023, the Standing Working Group on Ageing developed a multi-year programme of work (2023-2027) for regional cooperation to support the implementation of the commitments under the Madrid International Plan of Action on Ageing, its Regional Implementation Strategy for the UNECE region (MIPAA/RIS) and the 2022 Rome Ministerial Declaration on Ageing. The project will contribute to strengthen capacity through enhanced knowledge on and guidance for the development of evidence-based policy measures. The objective of the project will be achieved by implementing the following activities:

- A1.1. Development of three policy dialogues on specific ageing-related challenges and solutions;
- A1.2. Drafting of two Policy Briefs on Ageing and organising launch events;
- A1.3. Development and maintenance of UNECE Ageing Policies Database;
- A1.4. Engagement of stakeholders (participatory approach) to identify gaps and emerging issues to be addressed by the regional policy framework on ageing in the future;
- A2.1. Development of a roadmap on Mainstreaming Ageing;
- A2.2. Development of mainstreaming ageing tools and training.

## **Expected results of the project:**

EA1. Increased knowledge of UNECE member States on ageing-related policy challenges and strategies;

EA2. Enhanced capacity of UNECE member States for evidence-based policy formulation on ageing.

## Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

Beneficiary countries: UNECE member States and their ageing populations. Target groups: national policymakers, civil society organizations and research institutions working in the field of ageing.

#### Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

The project directly contributes to the objectives of the population component of Subprogramme 8 "Housing, land management and population" "to advance evidence-based population and social cohesion policies" of the UNECE proposed programme budget for 2024 and to the implementation of the Programme of Work of the Standing Working Group on Ageing for 2023-2027 (ECE/WG.1/2023/2).
