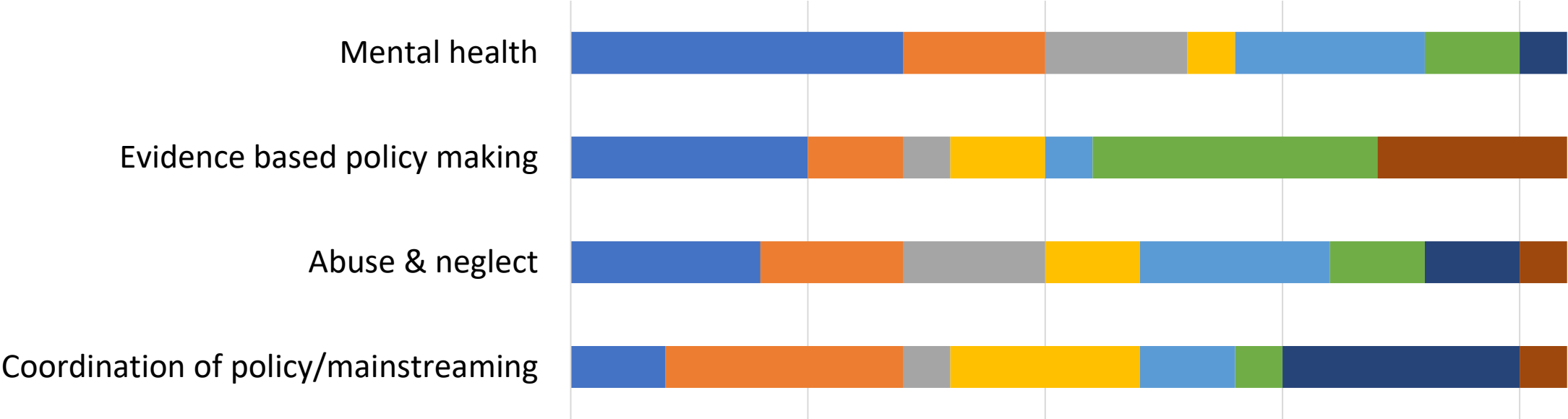



By 2050 about one in every four persons in the United Nations Commission for Europe (UNECE) region will be over the age of 65. Population ageing affects almost all aspects of society. Therefore, the transformative change required to adapt societies to the implications of population ageing and individual longevity cannot be achieved without a whole-of-government and whole-of-society effort. For this reason, mainstreaming ageing - that is, the systematic integration of ageing issues across all relevant policy fields and at all policy levels - is crucial.

# Capacity development | Item 7c (ii)



## Training Workshop on Age-Sensitive Analysis and Policy Formulation

- One or two day in-person training to introduce age-sensitive analysis of data and policy documents
- Focus on the identification of age-based inequalities, their causes and actions needed to address them
- Developed with UNFPA
- Piloted in the Republic of Moldova and Georgia



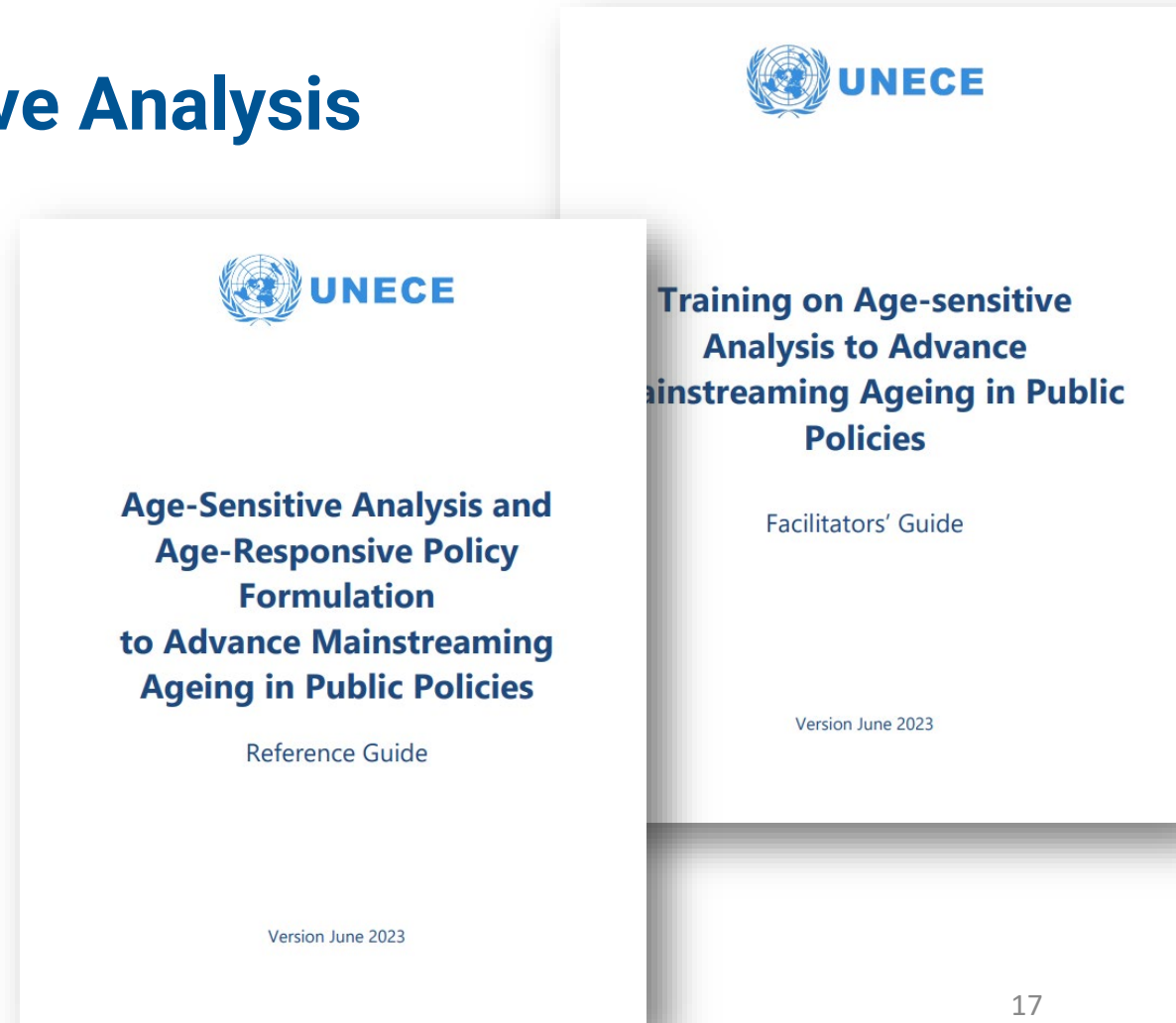

# Capacity development | Item 7c (ii)



## Expert Workshop on Mainstreaming Ageing

- Developed and piloted by BAGSO (Germany)
- A half-day expert workshop (in person or online)
- To discuss with national experts and stakeholders how ageing issues can be mainstreamed across government policy
- The workshop introduces the concept and methods of mainstreaming ageing, and draws on **lessons learnt** from **gender mainstreaming**

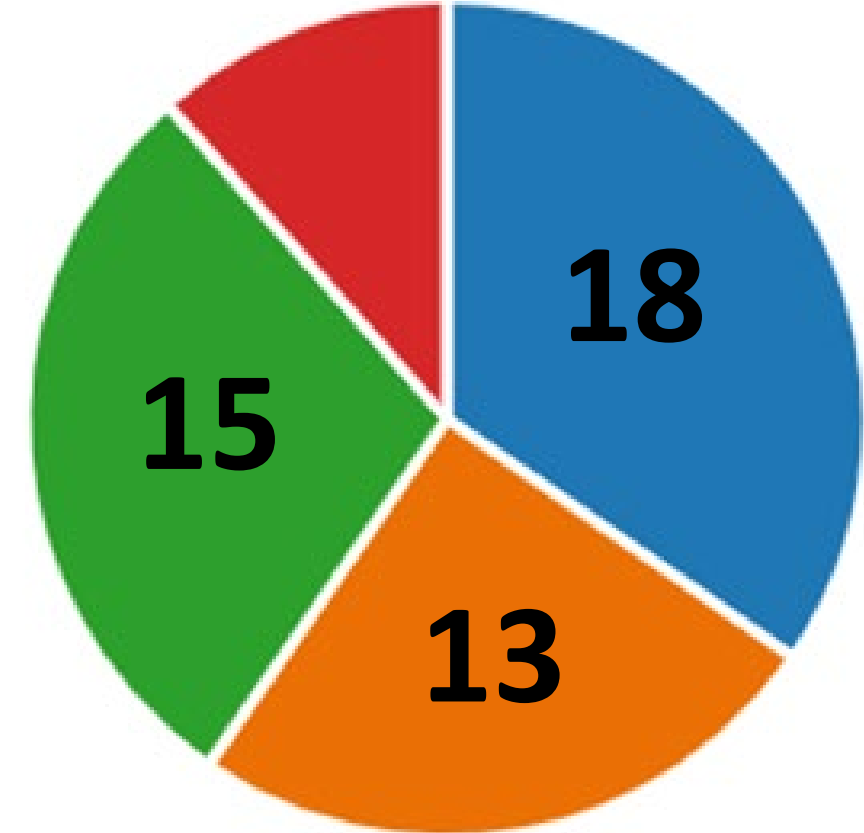

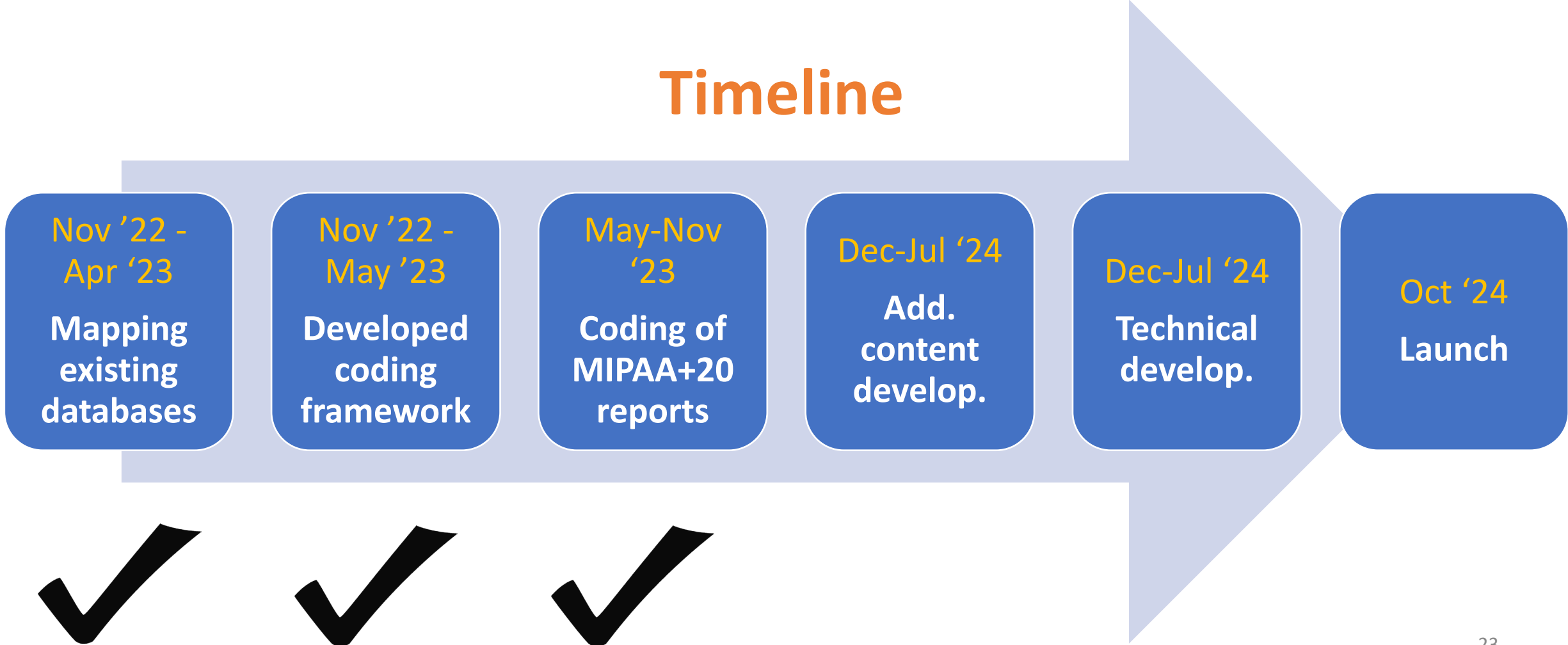
## Objectives

# UNECE Ageing Policies Database | Item 7d (iii)



The objective of the **National Strategic Policy for Active Ageing 2023-2030 of Malta** is to mainstream ageing and to protect the human rights of older people by mitigating against age discrimination ... While the Ministry for Active Ageing is the institution responsible for leading the implementation of the recommendations of the policy, different Ministries are to ensure the necessary funding and human resources for initiatives that fall under their respective responsibility are available ... While some of the recommendations are aimed directly at older persons, in terms of scope, many call for action on the societal level. A key feature of the policy are its comprehensive list of planned measures and initiatives. In terms of timeline, the policy will be implemented in the years 2023-2023.

# UNECE Ageing Policies Database | Item 7d (iii)



## Coded all MIPAA+20 reports

- Identified **all policies** in 41 MIPAA+20 reports
  - Approx. **2,500 policies** & measures
- Coded them according to policy themes & instruments
- Identified sources (if possible)
- Attributed tags/keywords

# Group discussions | Item 7d



- At its 15<sup>th</sup> meeting the **Bureau** agreed that the **topic for the discussion groups** for SWGA16 should be on the **possibility of developing a quantitative monitoring framework** for MIPAA/RIS
- Under “Strengthening the evidence base through ageing-related and age-disaggregated data” the **Programme of Work 2023-2027** states that “SWGA, supported by the UNECE secretariat, will **develop** an **indicator framework** to facilitate the **quantitative monitoring** of progress in implementing MIPAA/RIS and the 2022 Rome Ministerial Declaration at regional and national levels.”
