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CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN is a global problem that transcends cultural, geographic, religious, social and economic boundaries.

The United Nations defines violence against women as "any act of gender-based violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual, or mental harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life"

"Declaration on the Elimination of Violence Against Women" (Resolution 48/104 dated December 20, 1993)

The Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action adopted at the Fourth World Conference on Women (September 1995)

DATA SOURCES ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

Administrative

Statistical data is provided by law enforcement agencies and healthcare organizations (Ministry of Internal Affairs, Prosecutor's Office, Ministry of Health, Supreme Court, etc.), as well as crisis centers and other specialized institutions to the CIS National Statistical via official statistical reporting forms.

KYRGYZSTAN

Statistical reporting form No. 1-KTs "Report of an organization, crisis center, shelter, court of aksakals providing social services and assistance to the population"

The official data on violence against women is scarce, as violence is usually not reported, especially in case of sexual offenses or family violence.

Surveys (ad hoc; MICS)

Surveys provide the most accurate data on the form, frequency, limitation period, circumstances and causes of violence.





The entry into force of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development on January 1, 2016 once again made combating violence against women and girls a priority at the highest international level.



Goal 5 of the 2030 Agenda: Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls Target 5.2 "Eliminate all forms of violence against all women and girls in the public and private spheres, including trafficking and sexual and other types of exploitation"

The national statistical offices of the CIS Member States have gained some experience in conducting sample surveys on violence, the findings of which are published in the annual compendium on the monitoring of SDG indicators in the CIS countries.



EXPERIENCE OF CIS NATIONAL STATISTICAL OFFICES IN CONDUCTING SURVEYS ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS

On November 1, 2022, the CIS Statistical Committee held a meeting by videoconference for specialists from the national statistical offices of the CIS Member States, attended by UNFPA and UNECE representatives and international experts, on the statistical study of violence against women and children. EXPERIENCE OF NATIONAL STATISTICAL OFFICES IN THE CIS IN CONDUCTING SURVEYS ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS

MOLDOVA

In order to gain knowledge in the field of violence against women, the National Bureau of Statistics conducted the first-ever survey "**Domestic Violence against Women**" in 2010



TURKMENISTAN

The national sample survey "Health and Status of a Woman in the Family" was conducted in 2021

The surveys used the methodological approaches and tools developed by the WHO for the multi-country study on women's health and violence





EXPERIENCE OF NATIONAL STATISTICAL OFFICES IN THE CIS IN CONDUCTING SURVEYS ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS



Multiple Indicator Cluster Surveys (MICS) began in 1995. By 2022, they had been conducted 349 times in 118 countries. The surveys collect statistical indicators on the health of women of reproductive age, mothers and children, children's rights, enrollment rates and physical development.

KEY PROBLEMS AND CHALLENGES

Key problems

- Data is not always disaggregated
- Significant data release gap
- Data is often not publicly available
- Additional material and financial costs associated with surveys

To achieve a lasting change in the situation of violence against women and girls, it is IMPORTANT to:

- Draw attention to the problem of violence against women and girls at the government level in order to adopt decisions aimed at preventing acts of violence, as well as providing assistance to victims of violence, conducting information and educational activities on the prevention of violence against women and girls, particularly for law enforcement officers, health care workers, psychologists and social workers who provide assistance to women in crisis situations;
- Carry out constant monitoring of statistical information on violence against women and girls with the publication of all necessary conclusions, comments and recommendations;
- Conduct MICS surveys, demographic and health surveys, and include the topics of violence against women and girls in other surveys at the national level;
- Collect disaggregated data on violence.
