Eco label of Serbia

- Serbian Eco-label was established in 2009, and it is fully operational as a "mirror instrument" of EU Eco-label.
 - National Eco-label of Serbia operates within same product groups and with same criteria as EU Eco-label.



This is a Type I environmental labelling programmes, which award Serbian Eco label to products that meet a set of predetermined requirements.

Ecolabelling in Serbia, as in EU countries is voluntary-based.

A fitting criteria to be achivable for small size touristic accomodation service providers, sims to be right way to go.










Environmental rating of mobile phone

The Eco Rating evaluation assesses devices' different environmental indicators (e.g., carbon footprint or resource depletion) and material efficiency criteria, which results in an overall score on a scale from 1 to 100. The closer the score is to 100, the better the sustainability performance of the device..



PRTR system in Serbia

- Aarhus Convention and the Protocol on PRTRs are two important legally binding ECE instruments, which are driving positive changes in the region and globally.
- A pollutant release and transfer register (PRTR) is a system for collecting and disseminating information about environmental releases and transfers of hazardous substances from any human activity, with a focus on industrial facilities.
- Example of PRTR system in Serbia has been acknowledged as innovative and exemplary by the Working Group of the Parties
- Serbia has an advanced digital system which assure reliable data for public access and use by the government.

Serbian National Register of Pollution Sources

- The National Register was established to meet the growing needs of state authorities, as well as the wider community, for information on sources and quantities of polluting substances emitted to the environment. It also includes reporting on resource consumption and production volume.
- The National Register of Pollution Sources (NRPS) is a set of systematic information and data on environmental pollution sources. That is a register of all human activities that may have a negative impact on the quality of the environment in a certain area.
- This Register is an information subsystem of the Environmental Information System of the Republic of Serbia, which is managed by the Environmental Protection Agency in accordance with the Law on Ministries and the Law on Environmental Protection.

PRACTICE:

Using PRTR and NRPS Information to Evaluate Progress Towards the Sustainable Development Goal 12 - Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns.

IDEA:

Aiming one segment of LCA in product environmental footprint, we could use PRTR and NRPS Information in specific industries to calculate polution per product or per amount of product.

There is a possibility of placing this kind of information on the product in a form of Type III environmental claim.

Conclusion

- During introduction of the Eco-labeling system efforts should be made to ensure that the topic is constantly present in public through promotional activities.
 - A private-public partnership could be more suitable for managing a national Eco-labeling scheme.
- The interest of companies lies in the connection of the Eco label with public procurement.
- More data on the sources and amounts of pollutants will enable decision makers to crete more efficient environmental policies.
