

Figure 1. Romanian population registered at PHC 1948, 1956, 1966, 1977, 1992, 2002, 2011 and 2021




General trends in population (2)

- Population decline factors after 1990s:
- freedom of movement
- increasing the age at which young people choose to marry
- delay in the age at which young mothers choose to have their first child
- reduction in the number of children born per couple
- a decrease in birth rates








Figure 5. Romania - Population projection, 2025 - 2100



Usual versus legal residence population


Difference between usual residence vs legal residence on population aged 0-19 (%)

New statistical indicators to be considered:







Children born by minor mothers

Economically active and employed population

NEET rate



usual residence

Conclusions

- A more precise tool for assessing and addressing the risks faced by children in different communities.
- Replacement of the legal population currently included in the index with the usual residence population.
- A current limitation: such detailed data are only available at the NUTS 3 level; however, with the progression towards establishing a comprehensive Population Register, more detailed demographic data at the localities level will enhance in the future for precision of planning and policy-making.
