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Why is regulation being introduced?

For decades we have:

Over produced



PROFIT AT THE EXPENSE OF PLANET AND PEOPLE.

Over consumed



VOLUNTARY STANDARDS HAVE ONLY BEEN SUCCESSFUL TO A SMALL DEGREE

NOW LEGISLATION IS FORCING CHANGE.





Why is livestock management so important?

Without livestock:

No meat for the dietary need of a global population

No natural fertilization of the land

No natural deterrent to invasive species

No natural encouragement of beneficial species

No raw material for the leather industry

New studies show that livestock farming can support carbon reduction

WE HAVE TO BE ABLE TO PROVE THAT FARMING OF LIVESTOCK AND THE **SUBSEQUENT** MANUFACTURE OF LEATHER IS NOT CONTRIBUTING TO **NEGATIVE** ENVIRONMENTAL, SOCIAL AND GOVERNANCE **CONSEQUENCES**
