What is the Equitable Access Score-card?



Analytical tool to establish a baseline, track progress and prompt discussions to support the implementation of policies and practices to guarantee equitable access to water and sanitation for all.

The Score-Card aims to assess i) the governance framework existing to achieve equitable access and ii) the existence of public policies to:



Reduce geographical disparities



Address the needs of vulnerable and marginalized groups



Ensure affordability in access to water and sanitation


