These consultations are crucial to ensure a comprehensive and inclusive approach to ratification.

We are pleased to inform the Working Group that we have set a clear timeline for the ratification process. It is planned to be ratified by the end of 2025. This timeline reflects our commitment to a careful and thorough review process, which we believe is essential for the successful implementation of the amendment.

In conclusion, I want to reiterate North Macedonia's steadfast commitment to the principles of the Aarhus Convention and its amendments. While we have faced some delays, our dedication to ratifying the GMO amendment remains unwavering. We appreciate the patience and understanding of the Working Group as we navigate this complex process.
