### Introduction

The topics for discussion are based on decision VII/4 on promoting the application of the principles of the Convention in international forums (ECE/MP.PP/2021/2/Add.1), adopted by the Meeting of the Parties at its seventh session, and the outcomes of the previous thematic sessions. The thematic session on the promotion of the principles of the Aarhus Convention in international forums will include panel presentations and round table discussion focusing on international decision-making with regard to energy; carbon-trading and other market-based mechanisms; and new or emerging technologies.

Additional topics will include updates on subjects considered by the Working Group of the Parties at its previous meetings, namely, promotion of the principles of the Convention in (a) the work of the International Seabed Authority; (b) stakeholder engagement in International Financial Institutions; (c) stakeholder engagement and access to information policies of the United Nations Environment Programme and United Nations Environment Assembly; (d) stakeholder engagement in Sustainable Development-related Processes; and (e) stakeholder engagement in UNFCCC processes, with the focus on carbon-trading and other market-based mechanisms.
