

Implementation of the Aarhus Convention (Directives: 2003/35/EU; 2003/4/EU; Regulation No. 166/2006)

- The Law on the state environmental monitoring system, information on the state of the environment (ecological information) and information support for management in the field of the environment was adopted;
- The National Pollutant Release and Transfer Register has become operational;
- Launch of the online procedure for strategic environmental assessment on EcoSystem; (will ensure the creation of a unified and publicly accessible database of SEO materials)
- Opened and updated the environmental impact assessment register with features of military status;
- The preparation of the National Report on the implementation of the Aarhus Convention for the years 2021-2024 has begun.
