# 3. Implementation of the Programme of Work of the Standing Working Group on Ageing in 2024

# (a) Raising awareness on ageing and its implications for sustainable development and synergies with related policy agendas

Members of Bureau will be briefed on several events and opportunities in 2024 to raise awareness on ageing and mainstream ageing into related international initiatives and agendas. Bureau members are invited to discuss strategies to further promote the inclusion of ageing through inter-governmental processes. Members of the Bureau are invited to share updates on relevant awareness-raising activities organized during the year.

### (b) International cooperation and exchange of experience and knowledge

### (i) Policy Brief

Bureau members are invited to provide feedback on the draft policy brief No. 29 on the mental health of older persons.
