Alignments with relevant standards



- All definitions of variables are aligned with the 2030 United Nation Statistics Division Principles and Recommendations (2030 UNSD P&R)
- Recommendations are also aligned with the most recent Resolutions from the *International Conference of Labour Statisticians* (ICLS) and the *System of National Accounts*



Summary of changes

- Key recommendations core variables: minor changes from the 2020 CESR
- Participation in own-use production of goods new core topic
 - Previously included in the concept of employment
 - Countries relying on administrative records as the main source in their censuses will normally lack such data need for surveying this topic specifically
- General recommendations
 - Countries should always use the most recent and updated versions of international standards
 - Sources differs among countries, thus, to promote international comparability, countries should provide detailed information on definitions and methodology used

 - \circ for the preparation of sample frames, and
