

BACKGROUND AND QUESTIONS	In recent years, the demand for compliance with environmental, social and governance (ESG) standards in global value chains, supported by traceability and transparency, has increased dramatically, driven by consumers, investors, and regulatory bodies requiring verifiable claims for products placed on markets.  This policy dialogue will explore the evolving policy and regulatory context at global, regional and national levels; the challenges and opportunities that due diligence requirements pose for industry actors in target industries for the green and digital transitions (e.g. agri-food, textiles, critical raw materials); and the response through supporting initiatives, standards and instruments of lead players. These include the ongoing development of UNECE Recommendation No. 49 for Transparency at Scale, accompanied by its United Nations Transparency Protocol (UNTP) and Digital Product Passports (DPPs).  Guiding questions  How has the relevant policy, regulatory context been evolving recently, for compliance with ESG standards along global value chains and verifiable claims?  What are the challenges, opportunities and incentives for industry actors to meet due diligence and traceability requirements?  How can UNECE Recommendation 49, with its supporting UNTP for DPPs tools, enable the necessary harmonized data exchange?  What key initiatives are needed to scale traceability and transparency solutions globally, and how can collaboration enhance their impact?
